### **4 – CAMP COOK**

**Minimum requirements: Experience: One (1) year as a Camp Cook**

**Education: 6<sup>th</sup> grade**

**Wage rate: \$11.78 per hour; Overtime: \$17.67 per hr.\***

**\*Special wage rate:** Work to be performed on DPRI-funded projects will be paid no less than the indicated wage rate, but may be paid more where special Davis-Bacon Act rates apply.

**Duties:** Prepares and cooks food for construction related crew according to menus, mainly Filipino and American style dishes/cuisine. Cleans, cuts and cooks meat, seafood, poultry, fruits and vegetables. Washes pots, pans, dishes, utensils and other cooking equipment. Cleans cooking area to ensure sanitation and cleanliness. Budgets, inventories and requisitions food, ingredients and supplies needed.

**Duties:** Supervises, coordinates and schedules the activities of construction workers at project sites. Reads specifications and blueprints to determine construction requirements to plan procedures. Inspects work progress, equipment or construction sites to verify safety or to ensure that specifications are met. Locates, measures and marks site locations or placement of structures, fixtures or equipment.

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### **10 – CONSTRUCTION EQUIPMENT MECHANIC**

**Duties:** Diagnoses, adjusts, repairs and overhauls mobile mechanical, electrical, construction, hydraulic and pneumatic equipment, such as bulldozers, graders, conveyors, dump trucks, backhoe, excavators and other heavy equipment. Repairs and replaces damaged or worn parts. Dismantles and reassembles heavy equipment using hoists and hand tools. Operates and inspects machines or heavy equipment to diagnose defects. Tests mechanical and electrical products and equipment after repair or assembly to ensure proper performance and compliance with specifications. Cleans, lubricates and performs other routine maintenance work on equipment and vehicles.

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**15 – ELECTRICIAN**

**Minimum requirements: Experience: Two (2) years as an Electrician**  
**Education: 6<sup>th</sup> grade**  
**Wage rate: \$18.52 per hour; Overtime: \$27.78 per hr.\***

**\*Special wage rate:** Work to be performed on DPRI-funded projects will be paid no less than the indicated wage rate, but may be paid more where special Davis-Bacon Act rates apply.

**Duties:** Plans layout, installs, maintains and repairs electrical wiring, equipment and fixtures based on job specifications and relevant codes. Connects wires to circuit breakers or other components. Tests electrical systems for continuity of circuits in electrical wiring, equipment or fixtures using testing devices, such as ohmmeters, voltmeters, oscilloscopes, ammeters or test lamps, to ensure compatibility and safety of system. Uses a variety of tools or equipment, such as power construction equipment, measuring devices, power tools, and testing equipment. Inspects electrical systems, equipment or components to identify hazards, defects or the need for adjustment or repair, and to ensure compliance with codes.

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**20 – PLUMBER**

**\*Special wage rate:** Work to be performed on DPRI-funded projects will be paid no less than the indicated wage rate, but may be paid more where special Davis-Bacon Act rates apply.

**Duties:** Assembles, installs and repairs pipes, fittings and fixtures of heating, water and drainage systems according to specifications and plumbing codes. Inspects structure to ascertain obstructions to be avoided to prevent weakening of structure resulting from installation of pipe. Locates and marks position of pipe and pipe connections and passage holes for pipes in walls and floors using ruler, level and plumb bob. Cuts openings in walls and floors to accommodate pipe and pipe fittings using hand tools and power tools. Bends pipe to required angle by use of pipe bending machine or bending by hand. Assembles and installs valves, pipe fittings and pipes composed of metals and plastic. Installs and repairs plumbing fixtures.

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**15 – SHEET METAL WORKER**

**Minimum requirements: Experience: One (1) year as a Sheet Metal Worker**  
**Education: 6<sup>th</sup> grade**  
**Wage rate: \$16.73 per hour; Overtime: \$25.10 per hr.\***

**\*Special wage rate:** Work to be performed on DPRI-funded projects will be paid no less than the indicated wage rate, but may be paid more where special Davis-Bacon Act rates apply.

**Duties:** Fabricates, assembles, installs and repairs sheet metal products and equipment, such as ducts, control boxes, drainpipes and casings. Sets up and operates fabricating machines to cut, bend and straighten sheet metal. Shapes metal over anvils, blocks or forms using hammer. Installs prefabricated sheet metal ducts used for heating, air conditioning or other purposes. Determines project requirements including scope, assembly sequences and required methods and materials, according to blueprints, drawings and written or verbal instructions. Lays out, measures and marks dimensions and reference lines on material. Fastens and smooths seams and joints together with welds, bolts, cement, rivets, solder, caulks, metal drive clips or bonds to assemble components into products or to repair sheet metal items. Fabricates or alters parts. Selects gauges or types of sheet metal or nonmetallic material according to product specifications. Maneuvers completed units into position for installation and anchors the units. Drills and punches holes in metal for screws, bolts and rivets.

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**10 – WELDER**

**\*Special wage rate:** Work to be performed on DPRI-funded projects will be paid no less than the indicated wage rate, but may be paid more where special Davis-Bacon Act rates apply.

**Duties:** Uses hand-welding, flame-cutting, hand soldering or brazing equipment to weld or join metal components or to fill holes, indentations or seams of fabricated metal products. Welds components in flat, vertical or overhead positions. Operates safety equipment and uses safe work habits. Lays out, positions, aligns and secures parts and assemblies prior to assembly using straightedges, combination squares, calipers and rulers. Examines work pieces for defects and measures work pieces with straightedges or templates to ensure conformance with specifications. Sets up and operates hand and power tools common to the welding trade such as shielded metal arc and gas metal arc welding equipment. Clamps, holds, tack-welds, heat-bends, grinds or bolts component parts to obtain required configurations and positions for welding.
